32.5Km
(Plettenberg Bay to Knysna)

Activities on this road - Off the N2 onto the R337
Diepwalle Forest Station - The Elephant Trails
For info call Diepwalle Forestry Station on 044 382 9762/3.
Three trails of varying difficulty, wind their way through the
pristine Knysna forest, starting and ending at the Diepwalle
Forestry Station. The trail is a mix of forestry road, woodcutter
trails and boardwalks, winding its way past giant old yellowwoods,
sinkhout trees, gurgling streams and beautiful tree ferns.
• Black Route: 9km, circular (easy: 3-4 hours)
• White Route: 8km, circular (moderate: 3-4 hours)
• Red Route: 7km, circular (moderate to difficult: 3-4 hours)

Robberg is a national monument and World
Heritage Site. Rocks date back 120 million
years to the breakup of Gondwanaland and
evidence of middle and late Stone Age inhabitation
has been found in a few of the caves along the
peninsular. Visitors can find out more at the
Nelson Bay cave interpretive centre.

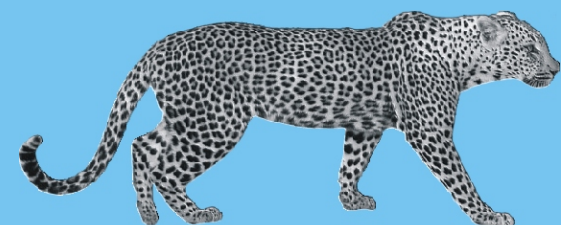
Whale Watching

The Plettenberg Bay area is world renowned for whale watching. The old whaling station was built on the site of the Beacon Island Hotel in the early 1900's and parts of the iron slip-way are still visible today. Whales that frequent these waters are:

- Bryde's Whale
- Humpback Whale
- Southern Right Whale
- Orcas (or the Killer Whale)
- Sei Whale (similar look to the Bryde's Whale but they are much larger)

Ways to view these giants are:

- Walking along the beach
- Join one of the organised boat trips (Ocean Blue Adventures) - scheduled trips each day, particular during whale season
